



## Sculpture Event

### Your assignment:

Create a miniature sport that you can really play on a small surface. Create the playing field, the players so that they may be interacted with and moved to play your game, any sporting equipment that is needed, and any sidelines decorations so long as they do not get in the way of viewer interaction with the game pieces.

### Criteria:

Create the sports arena or field no larger than 2 feet in any direction (height, width, length)

Create the players- while you do not need full teams, you should have enough players on either team so that participants interacting with the miniature sports field can actually play (2 players per team minimum is a good rule of thumb)

Create sideline decorations if appropriate- making sure they do not get in the way while interacting with your sculpture

Make your game interactive and usable by guests viewing it;  
Make sure it's sturdy enough to hold up to kids playing with it as intended.

Make sure all components of your work are to scale.

Neatly sign your first and last name and your school's Tech Wars ID number on the **bottom** of the sculpture.

Students may work independently or in pairs, but not in larger groups.

All sports equipment and components of the sculpture should be homemade (not found objects): Please do not recycle a toy basketball hoop by hot gluing it into your project- Make your own! The only exception to this is the ball you use- feel free to use a pre-constructed ball!
